SPICER'S PEAK SEMI-BASE CAMP - June 16th-18th - Leader Brian Hart. Closing Date
For Nominations - Thursday, 8th June - Fare 30/- - Departure Point - Friday evening
at Greyhound Brisbane Depot - 6.30pm.

After the bus journey terminates on Friday night there will be a walk of approximately 2½ miles up to an old deserted house which is the camp-site.

Spicer's Peak - 3840' - was named after Peter Spicer, a convict overseer who first visited the area looking for escaped convicts and together with Mt. Huntley - 4853' - it forms Spicer's Gap through which used to run the road which was the main supply route to the Darling Downs as the track through Cunningham's Gap was too rugged in those days. There used to be three bush inns in this area and relics of these may still be seen. Originally it was intended to run the railway which terminates at Mt. Edwards right through Spicer's Gap to the Downs.

The mountain affords a pleasant ascent and from the top there is a magnificent view of all the great mountains along to Barney and beyond to the cone of Mt. Warning. Back the other way, looking past Mt. Mitchell - 3751' - and Mt. Cordeaux - 4100' - the view takes in the Ramparts right along to crags of Castle Mt.

This trip is recommended as a very pleasant and interesting one, and for many it will open up a new aspect of the great Scenic Riv.
