## COMING EVENTS IN DETAIL

LONG WEEKEND 12-15th JUNE - BASE CAMP/THROUGHWALK - TWEED PINNACLE: FARE \$5.00

Leaders - Paul Tracey T/W Brian Hanvin B/C Transport from North Quay (behind Trittons) at 7.00p.m. Nominations close on 8th June, 1970. Emergency Officer - Mike Laherty (97.6303)

If you have not nominated for this trip but would still like to go, just check with the Outings Secretary first; there may still be room for you to come.

The throughwalk will definitely start from the Wiangaree side, thanks to the N.S.W. Forestry Department and the Army, who have provided a first-class super (dirt) highway into Wiangaree State Forest.

Unfortunately they will not now be accompanying the cattle and other livestock down, but will instead be accompanying the basecampers who will leave them by the wayside some eight to ten road miles north-east of Wiangaree and travel on via Kyogle round to near the base of the Tweed Pinnacle outside Tyalgum. Whether the basecampers continue on Friday night or on Saturday depends largely on when the throughwalkers arrive at their campsite (which is some 120 road miles from Brisbane) because at this point the basecampers still have about 70 miles to go.

Full water bottles will be essential on this trip, especially for the throughwalkers.

Finally, Mass. So far there is no Priest available to go on either the base camp or the throughwalk, so Mass will be attended at either Tyalgum or Murwillumbah.

# SUNDAY 28th JUNE - DAY WALK - IVORY'S ROCKS/MT. GOOLMAN

The Teviot Range, of which Ivory's Rocks and Mt. Goolman are part, commences south of Amberley and finally blends into the Dugandan hange which runs into the Fassifern District.

If approached from the western side, a particularly striking craggy block now known as Ivory's Rocks is very prominent. This craggy outcrop bears a sharp resemblance to an axe, and indeed the local aboriginal word for this peak was GULMAN (or stone ace). Over the years, however, the name has come to be applied to the 1490 feet coneshaped peak just to its north.

The present-day Ivory's Rocks consist of two formations, one much larger than the other. The larger formation contains some interesting caves.

The ascent of Goolman rewards the climber with the proverbial 360 degree panorama embracing the McPhersons, Cunningham's Gap, Moreton Bay and the Daguilar Ranges. Depending on the direction faced, the Ripley and Fassifern Valleys are in the foreground, and some magnificent eucalypt trees may be found in the surrounding forests. It is also possible that the black wattles will be in full bloom.

Bring full water bottles.

Three helping one another bear the burden of six.

# WEEKEND 3rd-5th JULY. - BASE CAMP/THROUGHWALK MISTAKE RANGE: FARE 84.50

The Mistake Range lies immediately to the east of the Great Dividing Range, which it joins near Mt. Castle.

The Great Divide, which runs north from Cunningham's Gap, takes a sharp turn from Near Mt. Castle, and in fact runs northwest from this point. The range which continues northwards, and which was thought by the early explorers to be the Great Divide itself, is the Mistake Range.

Both the basecampers and the throughwalkers will visit the Mistake Range itself. It is also hoped to include Mt. Castle on the programme.

Mass will be attended at Laidley on Sunday Evening.
