Mt. Walker Rosewood District

Fare 10/- per head. Closing date for nominations Monday July 27th.

Departure Point Anzac Square (City) Bus leaves at 9.0 a.m.

Mt. Walker 1,540 ft. is situated south of Rosewood and its summit affords fine views of the Mistake Range and the Great Dividing Range beyond. Cunningham's Gap and the great peaks beyond it are also well seen from here.

The mountain was originally named by Alan Cunningham Mt. Forbes after the chief justice of N.S.W.

Cunningham originally intended the road to the Gap to run up the Bremer River Valley behind Mt. Walker.

Conditions will probably be dry on the mountain and it is advisable to bring full water bottles.

The bus should be back in Brisbane at approx. 9.0 p.m.
