Departure Point Greyhound Bus Depot Friday Sept. 25th. at 6.30 p.m.

Mt. May which rises to 2,725 ft. is situated between Mt. Maroon and Mt. Ballow. It has twin summits and from it the view of the flanks of the Mt. Barney Massif are particularly impressive. There are also good views of the rain-forest-clad slopes of Mt. Ballow, which rises to a height of over 4,000 ft. and of Mt. Maroon.

The party will be camped on a tributary of Teviot Brook, called Waterfall Creek and a small waterfall and gorge is situated about 300 yards from the camp.

There is good swimming in the area.

Reminder on Nominations and Cancellations for Outings.

To facilitate the work of the Outings Secretary, it would be appreciated if attention could be paid to the following points:-

1. Please endeavour to have all nominations in by the set date as advertised in circulars.
2. Those going by private transport are also expected to submit their nominations on the nomination form and to include the amount payable for all those going with them in their vehicle.
3. When it is announced that refunds on trips have become available, it would be appreciated if those concerned would arrange to have the refund collected as soon as possible.

Attention to these matters would be greatly appreciated.

By-Law in Relation to Alternative Trips on Official Outings.

The General Committee has brought in the following by-law to cover alternative trips on official outings:-

"Any person wishing to lead a party on any other than the official Club programme which is carried out by the official leader shall forward full details in writing of the proposed route to the General Committee for approval. Such application shall be made in time to be considered by the Committee at its normal meeting before the outing in question and if approved such alternative trip will be gazetted in the monthly circular. The official leader shall be in charge of the whole party."

It is the policy of the Club to cater for all members and to have outings arranged to suit this aim as fully as possible.

In planning outings for the twelve months of next year, the General Committee is keen to organise bushwalking trips that will suit all requirements as well as develop the abilities of members.

Attempts are being made to foster through-walking, and those who participate in these outings will find that they provide good opportunities to learn more about places that are not always accessible on weekend outings at a base camp.

Suggestions from the general body of members regarding all types of trips will be welcome. These may be made either in writing to the General Committee or at the General Meetings.
