OUTINGS PROGRAMME

Sunday 8th October - Day Walk Samford to Strathpine - Leader Bob Chinn - no nominations required - assemble at Central Station in time to catch 9.15 a.m. train to Ferny Grove - buy your own single ticket to Ferny Grove. From Ferny Grove a bus will take the party to Samford where walking will commence. The walk is through pleasant rural country where farming for small crops and dairying is carried on. The D'Agular Range is seen to best advantage from this area and fine views, particularly of Mounts Nebo, Glorious and Samson are available. It should be possible to have a pleasant swim at Drapers Crossing before reaching Strathpine. The party will return to Brisbane by bus about 5.30 p.m. Participants in this trip will pay their own fares on both buses.

Weekend Outing - 20/22nd October 1961 - Wilson's Peak - Leader Merv. Galvin - Nominations (£1.10.0 for bus - 5/- per head for private transport (married couples 5/-)) should reach the Outings Secretary at the Club Box by Thursday 12th October 1961. Wilson's Peak (4035') is a neighbour of Mt.Superbus marking the meeting of the McPherson Range with the Great Divide about 25 miles east of Warwick and is located in an area abounding in bushwalking treasures. Remarkable for its conical shape, Wilson's Peak (aboriginal name was Jirramun) was once an active volcano. Some very heavy landslides have taken place at various times and their scars are an interesting feature. It is rumoured that the mountain-top has some special attraction for lightning and a storm at the right time could verify this - that is if viewed from a safe distance!!

Campsite will be situated on Teviot Brook which rises in the area (you may remember the lovely campsite at Minto Crags which was on the lower reaches of the Brook) and Saturday's trip will consist of the ascent of Wilson's Peak. Water bottles will be required for this portion of the trip and it is suggested that gaiters or similar protection for the legs be worn as some dense scrub will be encountered en route.

On Sunday it may be possible to visit Teviot Falls (320') which are close-by.

Bus will return for Evening Mass at Ipswich at 6.30 p.m. The Outings Secretary has a map of the area for the benefit of members interested in relating Wilson's Peak to other sites visited by the Club.
